DAY 2

WELCOME TO BUDAPEST

Sun. Jun 2, 2024

- Arrive at Budapest International Airport.
- Check into the hotel.
- Meet your tour educator and your local guide in the hotel lobby.
- Depart the hotel and drive to the top of Castle Hill, an ideal and spectacular spot to get your Budapest bearings. We'll look down on the beauty of the city and see how the Danube river separates the hilly Buda area from the flat lands of Pest. Castle Hill, a UNESCO World Heritage site, is named after Buda Castle, which was built in the 13th century and now hosts the Hungarian National Gallery and other major cultural institutions. We'll wander Castle Hill's cobblestoned streets and appreciate the remarkable rebuilding of this area, which was reduced to rubble after World War Two.
- Enjoy the panoramic views of Budapest from the top of the Fisherman's Bastion.
- Festive welcome dinner at a local restaurant.

DAY 3

JEWISH LIFE IN BUDAPEST

Mon. Jun 3, 2024

- Explore the story of Jewish Budapest over the past 160 years:
 - The Dohany Street Synagogue.
 - The Jewish Museum.
 - □ The Raoul Wallenberg Memorial Park.
 - Visit the newly renovated Rumbach Synagogue.
- Budapest, one of Europe's biggest Jewish cities, has seen an outpouring of new energy and ideas since the fall
 of Communism. We'll visit the JCC Budapest, Balint House to experience its activities and programs that have
 helped revitalize and rebuild Jewish communal life in the city.
- Meet young Budapest Jewish leaders and activists to talk about the issues that most concern them and hear what factors they believe will shape the future of Hungarian Jewry.

EDUCATIONAL & EXPERIENTIAL JOURNEYS CREATED WITH YOU IN MIND.



Who are the Neologs and How Do they Fit Into the Jewish World? We'll talk with Rabbi Tamas Vero and his wife Linda Vero-Ban at the Frankel Synagogue. Find out whether Hungary's main Jewish stream is closer to Reform, Conservative, or Orthodox Judaism and discuss what led Hungarian Jews to embrace this movement. We'll also explore why Frankel Synagogue is enjoying a new surge in popularity.

DAY 4

HUNGARY'S CONTRADICTIONS

Tue. Jun 4, 2024

- Is Hungary turning its back on democracy and returning to authoritarianism? Find out during this presentation by Gabor Gyori, senior political analyst at the Hungarian thinktank Policy Solutions. We'll also hear how the rise of Christian nationalist politicians, such as Viktor Orban, Hungary's prime minister and a proponent of "illiberal democracy," affects Hungary's Jews, the country and, indeed, Europe.
- Walking tour of Budapest:
 - Enjoy the lawns, walkways, and architecture of Liberty Square. We'll also see that the square provides important insights into the transformations and turmoil of recent Hungarian history and politics.
 - Walk by the Hungarian Parliament.
 - See The Shoes on the Danube, a moving, sparse memorial to honor the Jews who were massacred by Fascist Hungarian militia belonging to the Arrow Cross Party in Budapest during the Second World War.
- Meet with András Heisler, WJC Vice-President (Hungary) and President of the Federation of Jewish Communities in Hungary.
- Meet with the U.S or Israeli Ambassador.
- Budapest has in recent years developed into a European center for nightlife. Check out the scene on a free evening, including the many options for dinner.

DAY 5

FROM BUDAPEST TO VIENNA

Wed. Jun 5, 2024

- Check out of the hotel and drive to Vienna.
- Arrive in Vienna and meet your local guide.
- Take a panoramic orientation tour along the Ringstrasse, the main avenue circling the city center, for a view of the city's main landmarks, including: The Hofburg Palace, St. Stephen's Cathedral, St. Peter's Church.
- Tour Nachsmarket, the city's biggest food market. Enjoy a light lunch on own at the market.
- See The Kiss and other groundbreaking paintings by Gustav Klimt at the Belvedere Palace, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of Europe's most beautiful Baroque buildings.
- Check into the hotel.

DAY 6

VIENNA: CITY OF MUSIC AND JEWISH LIFE

Thu. Jun 6, 2024

- Take a look behind the scenes of the world's largest repertory operation and discover much that otherwise remains hidden from the evening opera-goer during a private guided tour of the Vienna State Opera.
- Visit the Stadttemple Synagogue, the only synagogue in Vienna to survive Kristallnacht and World War Two.
 Hear about the synagogue's role in Vienna's Jewish life today.
- Explore the Judenplatz, a center of Vienna's Jewish life.
- Visit the Judenplatz Holocaust Memorial, also known as the Nameless Library because it resembles a library where the books are unreadable.
- Continue to the Jewish Museum of Vienna with its innovative exhibitions about modern Jewish life in the city.
- Look for signs of the large Jewish community that once lived in Leopoldstadt, an island in central Vienna.
- Stop by the Carmelite Market, which includes kosher shops among its many stores and stalls, to see how Jewish communal life in Leopoldstadt is beginning to make a comeback after its destruction during World War Two.
- Return to the hotel.
- Enjoy a short private concert followed by an open discussion with Jewish singer, musician, and composer Benjy Fox-Rosen, the conductor of the Vienna Stadttempel Choir and a Yiddish singer.

DAY 7

FROM VIENNA TO PRAGUE

Fri. Jun 7, 2024

- Check out of the hotel and drive to the Czech Republic.
- In Brno, the second largest city in the Czech Republic, we'll learn about the long history of Jews in this city. At the Agudas Achim Synagogue we'll meet leaders of the Brno Jewish community.
- Continue to Prague.
- Arrive in Prague and check into the hotel.
- Gather together for a Shabbat service at the hotel, followed by a festive Shabbat dinner.

DAY 8

THE GLORY OF PRAGUE

Sat. Jun 8, 2024

- Tour the Old Town Square, Prague's main marketplace since the 10th century. See its Astronomical Clock, a symbol of the city.
- Usit the Prague Castle, enjoy an overview of the City of 100 Spires, and walk along the Golden Lane.
- Walk through the Lesser Town and over the Charles Bridge.

- Prague provides more than its fair share of beautiful spots, culture, and history to enjoy during your free time. Here are just a few recommendations:
 - Given the scenery, trails, and the glorious Vtlava River, Prague is an awesome place for a bike ride. There are numerous bike tours to enjoy and pink bikes dotted around the city for cheap rental.
 - Take the funicular or walk up Petřín Hill, a huge park with great views of the city. While you're up there, relax in the Rose Garden, enjoy some family fun in the Mirror Maze, or climb the 299 steps to the top of lookout tower.
 - Kampa and Letna Parks are also vast parks perfect for walks, lunch, and relaxation.
 - Popular places for Czech and European art include the massive National Gallery and its Veltzni Palac wing, the Museum Kampa, the Galerie Rudolfinim, and the Dox Center for Contemporary Art.
 - □ The Prague Zoo is one of the world's best.
 - □ The Franz Kafka Museum examines the relationship between the writer and his home city. It includes first editions of his works, photographs, original letters, and audiovisual exhibits.
 - The Czechs brew better beer than virtually anywhere on the globe. Join the locals for a drop in the many bars, beer gardens, and restaurants around the city or see how it's done at the Strahov Monastic Brewery. Cheers!
 - Explore what life was like in Communist Czechoslovakia in the Museum of Communism from the media and education to Stalinist brutality and the Velvet Revolution.
 - Prague is a city of culture and music. Check out the options at the National Theatre, the State Opera House, or the Rudolfinum (home of the Czech Philharmonic Orchestra) and keep an eye and ear out for the many concerts held in local churches.

DAY 9

JEWISH PRAGUE

Sun. Jun 9, 2024

- Discover the sometimes glorious, sometimes tragic, past of Prague's Jews with a walking tour to the Jewish ghetto. Our visit will include:
 - The Maisel Synagogue.
 - The Pinkas Synagogue.
 - The Old Jewish Cemetery.
 - The Spanish Synagogue.
 - The Altneushul.
- Share a coffee (or try a local Czech beer!) with residents from Moishe House, an international non-profit organization made up of a collection of homes throughout the world that serve as hubs for the young adult Jewish community.
- Meet with Dr. Azriel Bermant from the Institute of International Relations Prague, a specialist in Europe-Israel relations.



DAY 10

150 YEARS OF COMMUNITY

Mon. Jun 10, 2024

- Drive to the small town of Kolin, once home to one of the largest and most important Jewish communities in Bohemia.
- Celebrate B'nai Mitzvah as a community at the Baroque Synagogue of Kolin, the origin of our Czech Torah.
- Celebratory lunch.
- Return to Prague with remainder of the afternoon at leisure.
- □ Farewell dinner with a chance to share reflections at a local restaurant.
