# **PROGRAM ITINERARY**

DAY 1

DEPARTURE Tue. Apr 2, 2024

Depart the USA.

**Overnight:** Flight

### DAY 2

THE START OF A SPECIAL JOURNEY Wed. Apr 3, 2024

- Arrive at Warsaw International Airport and transfer to your hotel.
- 2:00 p.m. Meet for an orientation with your tour educator where you will review your itinerary and group themes and share group and personal goals.
- Visit the POLIN Museum of the History of Polish Jews, located in the center of what once was the Warsaw Ghetto.
- Check into the hotel.
- Short walk through Warsaw's Old Town. Established in the 13th century and destroyed by the German army during WWII, it was meticulously rebuilt using the original stones.
- Enjoy a welcome dinner at local restaurant MOMU.

### DAY 3

THE WORLD THAT WAS & THE WORLD THAT IS Thu. Apr 4, 2024

- Visit the Gensha Cemetery, one of the largest Jewish cemeteries in the world. Revive the names on the unique tombstones of famous Jewish leaders, artists, rabbis, and intellectuals.
- Visit the Nozyk Synagogue, the last remaining pre-WWII synagogue in Warsaw.
- Take a guided visit to the remains of the Warsaw Ghetto. At Mila 18, we will commemorate the doomed uprising and at Umschlagplatz, the holding area before transportation to the Treblinka death camp.
- Explore the Ringelblum Archives, an eye-witness record of life and death in the Warsaw Ghetto.
- Many of us know that our families and descendants once lived in Poland but understand little else about their lives and experiences. Meet the people who can help change that. The Jewish Genealogy & Family Center assists people from around the world in discovering their roots in Poland. We'll hear about how they search for clues, information, and insights that help rebuild family stories.
- Visit atop the Palace of Science & Culture: a very large symbol of past Soviet Power, one of Europe's tallest buildings from which you can get a 360-degree views of modern-day Warsaw. The Palace also hosted performances by notable international artists, such as a 1967 concert by The Rolling Stones, the first by a major western rock group behind the Iron Curtain.

### DAY 4

THE JEWISH STORY OF WOLOMIN Fri. Apr 5, 2024

- Check out of the hotel.
- 8:00 a.m. Private breakfast with Piotr Szulc, a local Pole deeply invested in Jewish History research in the city of Wolomin. Hear about his involvment with School for Dialogue and his involvement in sharing the Jewish History of Wolomin.
- We will walk the streets of Wolomin and connect with the town's Jewish history for what once was a flourishing Jewish community until World War II.
- Return to Warsaw.
- □ 1:46 p.m. Depart Warsaw on a train to Krakow.
- Packed lunch, en route.
- 4:00 p.m. Arrive in Krakow, check into the hotel and prepare for Shabbat.
- Optional Shabbat services at the Rema synagogue (Orthodox).
- Shabbat dinner with Klezmer live music at the quaint Klezmer-Hois restaurant in the Kazimierz Jewish Quarter.

### DAY 5

SHABBAT IN KRAKOW Sat. Apr 6, 2024

- Explore the Main Market Square, Krakow's city center and one of the best public spaces in Europe today. It combines modern street life with medieval architecture. One of the largest medieval squares still in existence, it is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- Visit the Wawel Royal Castle. This palace was the magnificent home of Poland's kings and rulers from 1038-1536 and is a key symbol of the nation's culture and independence. Highlights of the visit will include the stunning grounds and cathedral.
- Visit the Galicia Jewish Museum.
- Cross the bridge to the site of the Podgorze ghetto, from where many were deported to the death camps or were killed in 1943 when it was liquidated. See the following sites:
  - The Oscar Schindler Factory Museum tells the story of Krakow and its residents under Nazi occupation from 1939 to 1945.
  - The Krakow Umschlagplatz memorial, now called Ghetto Heroes Square, which was the center of the Podgorze Ghetto. Its "lonely chairs" are a monument to those who have vanished.
  - The Under the Eagle Pharmacy, a pharmacy inside the ghetto run by Tadeusz Pankiewitz. We'll hear how this Polish-Catholic pharmacist saved many Jews and was subsequently recognized by Yad Vashem as one of the Righteous among the Nations.
- Experience the authentic local cuisine and culture on a fun tasting tour.

### DAY 6

LAYERED MEMORIES AND THE PATH THAT BINDS THEM Sun. Apr 7, 2024

- Explore the Kazimierz Jewish Quarter. Once the heart of Jewish life in Krakow for 500 years, the quarter is now one of the city's most attractive and Bohemian areas. Our tour will include:
  - The Altshul. Built in the 15th century, this is the oldest synagogue still standing in Poland.
  - The Rema Synagogue, named after Rabbi Moses Isserles (the "Rema"), a great Talmudic scholar and codifier of Jewish law. It is one of the few synagogues in Krakow that is still active today.
  - □ The Rema Cemetery, where many renowned rabbis, including the Rema himself, are buried.
  - The Tempel Synagogue. No longer used as a synagogue, it instead hosts artistic events and is a key venue in the revival of Jewish culture in the city.
- Drive to the Wieliczka Salt Mines, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of Poland's most popular attractions. Guided visit through this underground labyrinth of tunnels and shafts, which houses a salt lake and many intricate statues and creations (including an entire chapel) chiseled out of salt.
- Return to the hotel.

### DAY 7

THE DESTRUCTION OF EUROPEAN JEWRY Mon. Apr 8, 2024

- 7:30 a.m. Depart the hotel and drive to the Auschwitz–Birkenau complex, the largest of the Nazi concentration and extermination centers and in all its inhumanity. Over 1.1 million people lost their lives in the Auschwitz camps.
- 9:30 a.m. Visit the first camp built at Auschwitz, a mass concentration camp. Here, we'll visit the Auschwitz museum which contains powerful artifacts and haunting footage of the lives and deaths of prisoners.
- Group lunch at the museum cafeteria.
- We will then make the short drive to the Auschwitz II death camp, also known as Birkenau. Largely untouched since the war, it provides intimate insights into the tragedy of the Holocaust. We'll reflect here on the personal stories of some of the Jews held and killed here and read accounts from survivors.
- Visit the Oswiecim Synagogue which stood as a silent witness to the Holocaust.
- Return to the hotel.
- At the Krakow Jewish Community Center, we'll talk with JCC deputy director Sebastian Rudol, and members of the local community, over dinner.

### FROM KRAKOW TO VIENNA

Tue. Apr 9, 2024

- Check out of the hotel and drive to Brno, the second largest city of the Czech Republic.
- Learn about the long history of Jews in Brno and visit the Agudas Achim Synagogue.
- Continue your drive to Vienna.
- Arrive in Vienna.
- Take a panoramic orientation tour along the Ringstrasse, the main avenue circling the city center, for a view of the city's main landmarks
- Check into the hotel, with evening at leisure.

### DAY 9

WONDERFUL VIENNA Wed. Apr 10, 2024

- Walking tour of Vienna, the city of Music: our introduction to Vienna will explore its rich musical History, including important influences from important Jewish figures, as we walk through Vienna's city center and pass some of the city's main landmarks.
- Tour of the Judenplatz, a center of Vienna's Jewish life.
- Visit the Jewish Museum's underground wing at the Judenplatz.
- Visit the Stadttemple Synagogue, the only synagogue in Vienna to survive Kristallnacht and World War Two.
   Hear about the synagogue's role in Vienna's Jewish life today.
- See "The Kiss" and other famous paintings by Gustav Klimt at the Belvedere Palace, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of Europe's most beautiful Baroque buildings.
- Enjoy a farewell dinner.

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### **DAY 10**

OPTIONAL EXTENSION OR UNTIL WE MEET AGAIN Thu. Apr 11, 2024

### OPTION 1: RETURN HOME


- Check out of the hotel and transfer to the airport.
- Return flight to the USA.

### OPTION 2: EXTENSION IN VIENNA

- Walking tour of Leopoldstadt: Look for signs of the large Jewish community that once lived in Leopoldstadt, an island in central Vienna. Stop by the Carmelite Market, which includes kosher shops among its many stores and stalls, to see how Jewish communal life in Leopoldstadt is beginning to make a comeback after its destruction during World War Two.
- Tour Nachsmarket, the city's biggest food market. Enjoy a light lunch on own at the market.
- Travel to the heart of the Habsburg Empire with a visit to the Schönbrunn Palace and Gardens.

- □ 8:00 p.m. Attend a live classical concert at the historic Sala Terranea of Mozarthaus.
