

PROGRAM ITINERARY

DAY 1

ON OUR WAY

Fri. Dec 20, 2024

Depart the USA.

Overnight: Flight

DAY 2

WELCOME TO ISRAEL

Sat. Dec 21, 2024

- Arrive at Ben Gurion International Airport.
- Check into the hotel.
- Meet your tour educator who will accompany you on this journey of education and inspiration.
- Mark the end of Shabbat and the beginning of our trip with a communal Havdalah ceremony overlooking the Old City.
- Enjoy a welcome dinner at a local restaurant.

DAY 3

A CITY OF LAYERS

Sun. Dec 22, 2024

- Stop at the Haas Promenade for a traditional "shehechiyanu" blessing of thanksgiving.
- Tour Jerusalem's Old City and the Jewish Quarter.
- Among the highlights will be:
 - A climb to the rooftops, overlooking the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, the golden Dome of the Rock, and the famous Hurva Synagogue.
 - □ The Cardo, the main street of Roman-controlled Jerusalem and its Byzantine-era columns.
 - King Hezekiah's "Broad Wall," built to protect Jerusalem from invasion 2,700 years ago.
 - Hurva Square, the center of modern-day life in the Jewish Quarter.
 - Enjoy photo opportunities at Live the Bible.
- Discover the Jerusalem Archaeological Park, including the Davidson Center, Robinson's Arch, and the Southern
 Wall steps where Jewish pilgrims entered the Temple Mount 2,000 years ago.
- Visit the Kotel (Western Wall), widely considered Judaism's holiest site. Each year, over one million notes containing prayers and wishes are placed in the cracks of the wall. We'll discuss the wall's historical and contemporary importance and experience its unique atmosphere.
- Explore the Western Wall Tunnel.



DAY 4

PASSAGES IN TIME

Mon. Dec 23, 2024

- Enjoy a B'nai Mitzvah celebration at the Egalitarian Kotel (in Hebrew "Azrat Israel").
- Plant a tree at the Jerusalem Bird Observatory and gain insight into the urban wildlife of Jerusalem through bird-watching and bird-banding.
- Take part in an interactive archeological dig geared to all ages at the Beit Guvrin Caves.
- Return to Jerusalem.

DAY 5

MEMORY AND RENEWAL

Tue. Dec 24, 2024

- Depart the hotel.
- Adults and children over 10: Visit Yad Vashem. Your guided tour will include:
 - The Avenue of the Righteous.
 - The Historical Museum.
 - □ The Children's Memorial, commemorating the 1.5 million children lost during the Holocaust.
- Share feelings and thoughts and discuss what we have experienced and learned.
- For children under 10: The Bloomfield Science Museum.
- Experience the sights, smells, and tastes of Jerusalem while walking through the Mahane Yehuda open-air market.
- Visit Pantry Packers, where you will pack food for Israel's poorest families.
- Optional: Walk in the Old City to witness the Christmas Eve celebrations in the Holy City of Jerusalem.

DAY 6

THE DEAD SEA BASIN

Wed. Dec 25, 2024

- Depart Jerusalem and descend to the Dead Sea Basin. Take the cable car to the top of Masada. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is where Jewish rebels are believed to have made their final attempt to resist Roman invaders (c 74 CE). We'll learn about Masada's importance as a symbol of Jewish defense and discuss its influence on modern Israel.
- Float into happiness at the Dead Sea. Not much can live or swim in what is the saltiest piece of water in the world, nine times saltier than the ocean, but the weightless feeling of floating is great.



- Hike in Nahal David, part of the Ein Gedi Nature Reserve. This is a desert oasis with springs, waterfalls, and freshwater pools. Featured are the ibex, hyraxes, and other desert mammals that live in this area.
- Enjoy a visit to Genesis Land, where you will ride a camel, take part in pita baking, like in biblical times, and enjoy a traditional "hafla" dinner in a spacious tent.
- Return to Jerusalem. Enjoy a festive Hanukkah candle lighting followed by a walk through the Jerusalem neighborhoods to view the Festival of Lights in the Holy City.

DAY 7

TO THE NORTH

Thu. Dec 26, 2024

- Check out of the hotel.
- Drive north on the Trans-Israel Highway and see the Security Barrier.
- Spend time at the Zippori National Park, known for its extraordinary ancient mosaics and its central role in Jewish life after the destruction of the Temple.
- Usit Rish Lakish Olive Press, located on Moshav Zippori in the Galilee.
- Drive to the Upper Galilee and check into the hotel.
- Enjoy Hanukkah candle lighting and dinner at the hotel.

DAY 8

SECURITY AND NATURE

Fri. Dec 27, 2024

- Take a nature walk along the Banias Stream, the second largest source of the Jordan River.
- Watch the views from Mt. Bental and gain insight about the reality in our neighboring countries.
- Hit the ground racing as we go off-road for a jeep tour of the Golan Heights that will combine natural beauty with insights into one of Israel's most strategically important areas.
- Join Gadi Elias and his family at their Baba Yona Ranch for Hanukkah candle lighting and a home hospitality dinner.
- Return to the hotel.

DAY 9

A TAPESTRY OF COMMUNITY

Sat. Dec 28, 2024

- Check out of the hotel.
- Encounter the Christian Crusaders and their Muslim rivals at Akko (Acre).
- Enjoy the overlook from the Baha'i Gardens.



- Visit a village on Mt. Carmel and meet Israel's Druze community.
- Spend an afternoon with Haifa's Ohel Avraham Synagogue at Leo Baeck and finish with a Hanukkah party.
- Enter Tel Aviv and check into the hotel.

DAY 10

THE ROAD TO INDEPENDENCE

Sun. Dec 29, 2024

- Walk along the Independence Trail in Tel Aviv and embark on a remarkable journey that begins with the founding of Tel Aviv in 1909 and ends with the establishment of Israel in 1948.
- Join the volunteer organization Leket Israel and pick fruits and vegetables for those in need.
- Visit the Ayalon Institute near Rehovot and its secret ammunition factory.
- Return to Tel Aviv and enjoy Hanukkah candle lighting.

DAY 11

A NEW CITY

Mon. Dec 30, 2024

- Modern Tel Aviv grew out of ancient Jaffa. Gaze out over the Mediterranean Sea; learn why Jaffa, mentioned in the biblical story of Jonah and the Whale, is so historically important; and see how its Old City reflects the present as well as the past.
- Usit the Peres Peace Center, created by the late Shimon Peres, former Prime Minister and President of Israel.
- Cryptic clues and madcap missions will let you discover, on this scavenger hunt in Neve Zedek, why one of Tel Aviv's oldest neighborhoods feels so young and cool.
- Participate in a municipal Hanukkah candle lighting.

A MOSAIC OF THE CITY

Tue. Dec 31, 2024

- Visit ANU Museum of the Jewish People, which is dedicated to telling the ongoing story of the Jewish people.
- Explore Nahalat Binyamin, Tel Aviv's arts and crafts market, before we move on to the Carmel Market.
- Eat, drink, and learn at the Carmel Market, where we'll sample food, sweets, and spices from all over the Mediterranean and the Middle East.
- Free time to enjoy the city.
- Late checkout of the hotel.
- Enjoy a festive farewell dinner and Hanukkah candle lighting.
- Group transfer to Ben Gurion International Airport and check in for your flight.
