

PROGRAM ITINERARY

DAY 1

ON OUR WAY Sun. Dec 15, 2024

Depart the US.

Overnight: Flight

DAY 2

BEN GURION'S DREAM Mon. Dec 16, 2024

- Arrive at Ben-Gurion International Airport.
- Meet your J² Expert Educator who will accompany you on this journey of education and inspiration.
- Drive south and stop to visit the grave and the house of Israel's "founding father," David Ben-Gurion, at Kibbutz Sde Boker.
- Continue to the hotel for check-in, followed by dinner.

DAY 3

FROM CRATER TO CREATIVITY

Tue. Dec 17, 2024

- Experience Makhtesh Ramon (Ramon Crater), the world's largest erosion crater, nearly 25 miles long and between 1-6 miles wide, shaped like an elongated heart. Marvel at the striking red and yellow layers and unique geologic formations. Explore this geomorphic wonder with:
 - A two-hour Jeep tour, where we'll start at the edge of the crater for an overview before descending to Wadi Ramon. Learn about the Makhtesh and its formation before continuing our trek to the summit of Mount Gvanim for a stunning view of the entire Makhtesh.
 - A walk to the unique natural phenomenon known as HaMinsara (The Carpentry Shop), which looks like a pile of wooden blocks, but are actually black basalt rocks. Along the way, explore the rock formations that were created by thousands of years of erosion.
 - Explore the harsh beauty of the desert and the insights of the people who make their home there. Desert experts from local Bedouin clans will accompany us on a camel ride into the astonishing Ramon Crater and reveal some of the secrets of traditional desert life. Our journey will conclude with an authentic local meal, where we'll experience Bedouin hospitality.
 - Stargazing on the edge of the Makhtesh (weather permitting). With its lack of light pollution and vast darkness, this is one of the best places in Israel for viewing the night sky. Enjoy the solitude as we identify some of our favorite constellations and perhaps spot a shooting star or two.

- Meet Chen Kotler, a resident of Kibbutz Kfar Aza. Learn with Chen about the events of October 7 and their aftermath.
- Visit Sderot and understand the new realities on the ground.

Return to the hotel for dinner and a debrief.

DAY 4

THE NEW HEBREW CITY Wed. Dec 18, 2024

Check out of the hotel.

- As we drive north on the Trans-Israel Highway, there will be plenty of opportunities to see the Security Barrier which runs along the seam zone between Israel and the Palestinian territories, and to learn about the barrier's effects on Israeli security and Palestinian communities.
- Modern Tel Aviv grew out of ancient Jaffa. Gaze out over the Mediterranean Sea; learn why Jaffa, mentioned in the biblical story of Jonah and the Whale, is so historically important; and see how its Old City reflects the present as well as the past.
- Walk through Jaffa's famous flea market Shuk Hapishpeshim.
- Explore colorful Neve Zedek, one of Tel Aviv's earliest neighborhoods, nowadays a cultural mecca hosting small boutiques, galleries, and the Suzanne Dellal dance and theater center.
- Walk through the quaint streets and restored buildings of old Rosh Pina, one of the first communities established at the dawn of the Zionist era.
- Continue to the hotel for check-in, followed by dinner.

DAY 5

NORTHERN EXPOSURE Thu. Dec 19, 2024

- At the Har Adir lookout point, hear from a research expert from the Alma Research and Education Center about some of the challenges facing Israel on its northern border.
- Visit Kfar Baram synagogue and the ruins of two ancient Jewish synagogues at the site of Kfar Bir'im, an ancient village depopulated during the 1948 Palestinian exodus and learn how ancient history and recent history come alive in one place.
- Join Liz and Shai in their home on the Merom Golan kibbutz for a meal and an occasion to savor. As we feast on Shai's "enchanted soup," smoked entrecote and fabulous vegetarian options, Liz, an actress and raconteur, will explain how this couple's love story came to include providing great food and the warmest of hospitality.

DAY 6

SPIRITUALITY AND BEYOND

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Fri. Dec 20, 2024

- Check out of the hotel.
- Explore Tsfat, a center of Jewish mysticism for hundreds of years and a contemporary artists' colony, including:
 - Guided visit to the Ari, Caro or Abuhav Synagogues, each with its great stories and mystical messages.
 - A stroll through the quaint Artists' Colony, shop in the galleries and crafts shops and engage in dialogues with local artisans inspired by the messages of Kabbalah.
- Drive south past Tiberias, an ancient/modern city located on the shores of Lake Kinneret (Sea of Galilee). One of Israel's four holy Jewish cities, this is where the "Jerusalem" Talmud was codified and where Maimonides is buried.
- Continue to Jerusalem. Enter the vibrant and colorful ancient city of Jerusalem and experience the convergence of the old and the new.
- We'll stop at the Haas Promenade for a stunning overview of the city and celebrate our arrival with a special ceremony and the traditional shehehiyanu blessing of thanksgiving.
- Check into the hotel. Freshen up for Shabbat.
- Kabbalat Shabbat services at Azarat Israel, the pluralistic section of the Kotel (Western Wall).
- Enjoy Friday night dinner with lone soldiers, young men and women who have come to Israel without their families to serve in the IDF.

DAY 7

SHABBAT IN JERUSALEM Sat. Dec 21, 2024

- Ascend the Old City Ramparts for a walk along the ancient walls of the city.
- Enter the Tower of David Museum for a walk through the city's history with observation points, an animated film, and visual and audio-visual aids – from the time of Abraham to the end of the British Mandate over Palestine.
- Yemin Moshe and Mishkenot Sha'ananim: Get to know the great banker and philanthropist Sir Moses Montefiore as you explore the pastoral neighborhoods, famous windmill, and the artists' colony that he developed and which transformed Jerusalem in the 19th century. En route, view two of modern Jerusalem's most storied and important landmarks: the King David Hotel and the YMCA building.
- At nightfall, we will mark the end of a special Shabbat with a communal Havdalah ceremony with members of the Kehillat "Shoham" Reform community led by Rabbi Rinat Tzfania.

DAY 8

LAYERS COME TO LIFE Sun. Dec 22, 2024

 J² Salon Talk: A Small Country With Big Questions. Geographically, Israel is one of the smallest countries in the world. However, few landscapes have played such a formative role in human civilization. What are the

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foundational elements that make up the story of Israel, and what key questions does Israel contends with as it continues to evolve in a shifting regional and international reality?

- Discover the archaeological treasures and other highlights of the Jewish Quarter:
 - Climb to the rooftops to see and discuss the ties and tensions between the different faith groups and communities of the Old City. From this one spot, we'll look out over the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, venerated by Christian groups as the burial place of Jesus; the golden Dome of the Rock, which is sacred to Islam; and the Jewish Quarter's famous Hurva Synagogue.
 - Walk through the Cardo, the main street of Roman-controlled Jerusalem and its spectacular Byzantine-era columns.
 - Stop next to King Hezekiah's "Broad Wall," a massive wall built to protect Jerusalem from invasion 2,700 years ago.
 - No visit to Israel is complete without experiencing the Kotel (Western Wall), widely considered Judaism's holiest site. Each year, over one million notes containing prayers and wishes are placed in the cracks of the wall. We'll discuss the wall's historical and contemporary importance and experience its unique atmosphere. Continue down the Southern Wall steps used by Jewish pilgrims to enter the Temple 2,000 years ago. But there is much else to see, including Robinson's Arch and the remains of a major Second Temple-period street.
 - Explore the Western Wall Tunnel, the underground continuation of the Kotel, and examine important archaeological discoveries that are revising our understanding of daily life in ancient Jerusalem.

DAY 9

THE POWER OF MEMORY Mon. Dec 23, 2024

- Visit Yad Vashem, the national memorial to the six million Jewish victims of the Holocaust, an essential emotional and educational experience. Your guided tour will include:
 - The Avenue of the Righteous, where trees symbolic of the renewal of life have been planted along with plaques honoring brave non-Jews who saved Jews during the Shoah.
 - The Historical Museum, a state-of-the-art interactive display reflecting decades of research and educational expertise. The story of the Holocaust, with an emphasis on individual victims, is told through survivor testimonies, original artifacts, and personal possessions saved from the ghettos and camps.
 - The Children's Memorial, commemorating the 1.5 million children lost during the Holocaust.
 - A memorial service where we will pay tribute to those who were lost. It will include the opportunity to talk about family members and loved ones who died during the Shoah.
- Drive through the Israeli "Capitol Hill": along the Knesset Israel's Parliament and its famous Menorah, the Supreme Court building, the Prime Minister's Office, the Israeli National Bank, and the Israel National Library.
- □ Jerusalem at night provides a very different vision of the Holy City. Experience Jerusalem nightlife.

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DAY 10

THE DEAD SEA BASIN Tue. Dec 24, 2024

- Enjoy an early breakfast at the hotel before setting out to explore the Dead Sea region.
- We'll drive to the Dead Sea Basin, 1412 feet below sea level and the lowest place on earth. The desert, the landscape, and the views are breathtaking.
- Take the cable car to the top of Masada with its extraordinary views and fascinating archaeological remains. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is where Jewish rebels are believed to have made their final attempt to resist Roman invaders (c 74 CE). We'll learn about Masada's importance as a symbol of Jewish defense and discuss its influence on modern Israel.
- Float into happiness at The Dead Sea. Not much can live or swim in what is the saltiest piece of water in the world, nine times saltier than the ocean, but the weightless feeling of floating is great fun.
- We'll drive by Qumran, where a separatist Jewish sect from the Second Temple period created an isolated community and where the Dead Sea Scrolls, some of the most ancient and important religious manuscripts in existence, were discovered.
- Return to Jerusalem and to the hotel.

DAY 11

QUESTION OF SOVEREIGNTY

Wed. Dec 25, 2024

- King Herod Villain, Visionary, or Both? Visit Herodian, where King Herod built an impressive palace-fortress and where he is believed to have been buried in 4 BCE. This archaeological site is the ideal place to explore the clout and character of one of ancient Israel's most influential and polarizing figures.
- Is Religion the Way Forward or an Obstacle to Peace? We'll go beyond the Green Line to meet with Ali Abu Awwad and Rabbi Hanan Schlesinger/ Rabbi Shaul Judelman from Shorashim (Roots), a program bringing West Bank Palestinians and their Jewish neighbors together despite their fears and suspicions.
- Join Professor Reuven Hazan of the Political Science Department at Hebrew University for an introduction into Israel's turbulent political scene where coalition governments and powerful ideological divisions are a fact of life.
- Take a multi-cultural tasting journey through the hustle and bustle of Jerusalem's Mahane Yehuda open-air market. This doubles as a delicious lunch.
- Late checkout from the hotel.
- Stop by a local gourmet bakery for a sufgania (doughnut).
- Farewell dinner at a local restaurant and celebrate the first night of Hanukkah.
- Transfer to Ben Gurion International Airport for your departure flight.


