

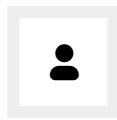

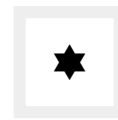

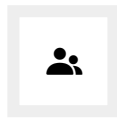

- Perched above the city near the Bahá'í Gardens, there's no better vantage point to understand the story of Haifa—its rich history and the

vibrant diversity of its people.

- Haifa, a city where Jewish and Arab citizens of Israel live side by side, is often celebrated as a model of coexistence. Through encounters with activists and local leaders, we will explore the realities and challenges of building a shared society.
- The communal gardens at the Leo Baeck School and Education Center have become a vibrant hub for greening the city and fostering connections among Haifa residents from all walks of life. During our visit, we'll learn about the planning and vision behind the gardens and take the opportunity to volunteer, contributing to Haifa's sustainability.

- Jewish and Democratic? In this session, we will explore Israel's Declaration of Independence and the variety of visions for its future,

examining the fundamental questions emerging the ongoing judicial overhaul. Is it possible to be both Jewish and democratic? This discussion is part of our ongoing Israel Today series.

- Recommendation: Check out the website of the International School at Tel Aviv University for live events, lectures, concerts, exhibitions, and tours of the campus.
- Recommendation: While exploring Tel Aviv University, be sure to visit the Cymbalista Synagogue and Jewish Heritage Center. A striking example of modern Israeli architecture, it serves as a museum and event space, offering a deeper look into the Jewish experience.

- Recommendation: Spend the day in Jaffa. From the churches and views at the top of the hill, to the sea-front promenade, and continuing to the galleries and flea market adjacent to the Ottoman clock tower, Jaffa always surprises.

- Take the next step toward becoming a local with our Hebrew language and culture sessions. Enhance your language skills while discovering the unique aspects of contemporary Israeli culture. This session is part of our ongoing Hebrew Language and Culture series.
- Head north in the afternoon for our Shabbat Field Seminar.
- Check into your hotel followed by dinner.

DAY 17

EXPLORING THE NORTH

Fri. Oct 31, 2025

- Our field seminar will explore the Galilee, delving into its rich history and diverse cultures, while examining potential scenarios for the region's future.
- From the Arbel Mountain, the entire Galilee is stretched before us. From this vista, we will explore the topography and human geography of Israel's north.
- We will visit a kibbutz in the Galilee finger, an area that was crucial in Israel's pioneering history. We will explore together the recent challenges posed by the war with Hizbullah, through the lens of civilian resilience and security concerns.
- Ascending to the Golan, we will meet with security experts from the Alma Center to discuss the collapse of the Syrian Assad regime and its aftermath for Israel and her neighbors.
- Returning to our hotel, there will be time to prepare for Shabbat. We will welcome Shabbat together as a group and enjoy a festive dinner at the hotel. Shabbat Shalom.

EXPLORING THE NORTH

- A short hike on Mount Meron will open our day as we explore the nature and the mystical traditions that are part of the very air of the Galilee area adjacent to Tzfat.
- Tzipori was the home of Rabbi Judah the Prince and it was there that the Mishnah was edited. We will visit the archeological park and reflect on this major shift in Jewish life from a Temple-based Judaism to a text-based Judaism.
- As we make our way back to Tel Aviv, we will visit the Druze villages of the Carmel Mountains. An encounter with Israeli Druze will also include a cooking workshop in a local home.
- Return to Tel Aviv.

DAY 21

RELIGION AND STATE - UNDERSTANDINGS OF JEWISH IDENTITY IN PUBLIC LIFE

Tue. Nov 4, 2025

- Religion and State is a crucial and thorny issue in Israeli life. What are the legal frameworks that define the relations between religion and

state in Israel? And what are the key issues surrounding the ongoing debate over the role of religion in the public sphere? This session is part of our ongoing series on Israel Today.

- Recommendation: If you looking for a walking trail in the Tel Aviv area, check out [alltrails.com/israel/tel-aviv](https://www.alltrails.com/israel/tel-aviv). Bring a hat and a bottle of water and stretch your legs.

DAY 22

JERUSALEM: DILEMMAS OF THE SACRED

Wed. Nov 5, 2025

- We will explore Jerusalem and encounter the topics, places, and people navigating the tensions between the ideal of a holy city and the realities of daily life.
- Beginning with contemporary Jerusalem, we will visit the "Hand in Hand" School, a unique, veteran educational institution that promotes Arab-Israeli education where Jewish and Arab children study together in a bilingual setting.
- A walking tour of Jerusalem's Old City offers an opportunity to explore the shared connections as well as shared tensions that exist between the Abrahamic faiths. Our walk will include:
 - The Church of the Holy Sepulcher is a site revered by the Pre-Reformation Christian world as the site where Jesus was crucified, buried, and resurrected.
 - The rooftops of the Old City provide one of the best views on the Temple Mount and the Muslim Shrines of the Al Aqsa and the Dome of the Rock.

- Lunch on own in the Jewish Quarter.
- The Western Wall is considered one of Judaism's most sacred sites. What is the story of the Western Wall and why was it referred to before 1967 as the "Wall of Tears"?
- Return to Tel Aviv.

DAY 23

THE BEATING HEART OF ISRAELI MUSIC

Thu. Nov 6, 2025

- Israeli music offers a vibrant and revealing window into Israeli culture and communal memory. We will participate in a workshop that focuses on select clips of iconic Israeli songs and explores what they reveal about Israeli lives and hopes. This session is part of our ongoing Hebrew Language and Culture series.
- Recommendation: Go underground to check out the popular music scene in Tel Aviv. At The Barby (Jaffa Port #1) and at The Levontin (Levontin #7), performances includes everything from folk to punk to indie rock. Get your groove on.

SHABBAT SHALOM - SHABBAT ON YOUR OWN

Fri. Nov 7, 2025

- Shabbat is your time to visit with friends and family and to get out and explore Israel. Please consult our concierge for assistance in making

- Recommendation: Join Beit Tfilah Israeli to bring in Shabbat. The Israeli Prayer House was established as a personal need of a small group of activists looking for a way to live a spiritual and community life in Tel Aviv matching the spirit of the time and place. Events take place at the Tel Aviv Port or along Rothschild Boulevard, depending on the season and on the weather, Check their website to see where they are meeting and when.

SHABBAT SHALOM - SHABBAT ON YOUR OWN

- Recommendation: Walk the Tel Aviv Botanical Gardens adjacent to Tel Aviv University to enjoy a unique collection of flora from around the world. Nearby is the Museum of Natural History, a renovated campus designed to resemble Noah's Ark.

- Recommendation: The Peres Center for Peace and Innovation showcases Israel's story as a start-up nation with guided tours in an interactive setting. Reserve tickets before your visit on the Peres Center website.

DAY 28

WHAT MAKES A PERSON ISRAELI ANYWAY?

Tue. Nov 11, 2025

- In Israel, nearly everyone has roots from somewhere else, but is that really true? We'll explore the timeline of immigration to Israel, its current challenges, and the famous saying: "Israel loves immigration (Aliyah), but doesn't really like immigrants (Olim)." This session is part of our ongoing Israel Today series.

- Recommendation: On Tuesdays and Fridays, Nahalat Binyamin's arts and crafts fair, with its 200+ booths, opens its doors. Whether you are looking for a special gift, a unique souvenir, or a photo opportunity, it's worth the visit.

DAY 29

HEBREW - A LANGUAGE THAT NEVER STOPS

Wed. Nov 12, 2025

- Hebrew slang is a salad of evolving influences. By examining its roots in Arabic, Yiddish, Turkish, and Russian, we can trace the development of modern Israel and define what's "in" and what's "out." This session is part of an ongoing series on Hebrew Language and Culture.
- Recommendation: Sarona was one of Tel Aviv's earliest neighborhoods. Today it is a culinary hub across from Israel's Ministry of Defense. Whether you crave sushi or a burger, desire a cold brew or a cold beer, drop by Sarona and enjoy.

DAY 30

THE NEGEV: NEIGHBORS AND BORDERS

Thu. Nov 13, 2025

- Departure in the afternoon for our Shabbat Field Seminar.
- Stopping in the city of Rahat, we will encounter the dynamic changes that have taken place among Israeli Bedouins since 1948 and the shifts in self-identity of a community holding onto the past and striving toward

a better future.

OR

The heart of Beersheva is Ben-Gurion University. Our encounter with the campus, students, and faculty will showcase the academic excellence that BGU is known for, but also look at the university as a community builder and major development generator for the entire Negev region.

- When David Ben-Gurion left office as Prime Minister of Israel, he retired to the quiet kibbutz of Sde Boker. Visiting Sde Boker, Ben-Gurion's modest home, and his tomb overlooking the Avdat Valley is an opportunity to both honor the man and to reflect on notions of leadership then and now.
- Check into your Negev hostel.

DAY 31

THE NEGEV: NEIGHBORS AND BORDERS

Fri. Nov 14, 2025

- The field seminar will explore concepts of neighbors and borders and their implications for life in the Negev.
- Built as a student village to bring brain power to the Negev, the village of Ashalim has also become home to many who before October 7 lived in the kibbutzim and moshavim of the Israel-Gaza border. We will meet with the residents of Ashalim and hear their experiences from a war not yet over, and hopes for a brighter tomorrow.
- Along the Israel-Gaza border, questions remain about rebuilding and about how to remember all those who were lost. Our visit to this

beautiful and haunted region will include:

- The memorial site, erected at the location of the Nova Festival and the tragic massacre that followed, is a grassroots initiative by families, friends, and local communities, giving voice to the survivors, honoring those who lost their lives, and remembering those who are not yet home.
- Moshav Netiv Ha'Aserah is a pioneering settlement that came under attack by Hamas at dawn on October 7. We will walk through the moshav with a local resident to hear firsthand accounts of that harrowing day, the events of the war in Gaza, and the ongoing efforts to rebuild both the moshav and the families affected.
- Returning to our hostel, there will be time to prepare for Shabbat. We will welcome Shabbat together as a group and enjoy dinner at our hostel. Shabbat Shalom.

 Overnight: Negev Desert, Israel  Meals: Breakfast, Dinner

DAY 32

THE NEGEV: NEIGHBORS AND BORDERS

Sat. Nov 15, 2025

- Check out of the hostel.
- Few countries can boast that archeology is a national sport. Visit the excavations at Beit Guvrin and Tel Maresha. Wander through the underground city and stand in awe at the Roman amphitheater, immortalized in Ridley Scott's "Gladiator."
- Stand at the top of Tel Azeka, Bible in hand, and gaze over the landscape where, according to tradition, David the Shepherd faced the

giant Goliath. What do we mean when we say "it happened here"?

- The historic site and memorial at Shar HaGai is dedicated to the history of the Independence War on the Jerusalem-Tel Aviv Road. Our visit will explore both the history and also the way that 1948 is recalled in Israeli literature and music.
- Return to Tel Aviv.

- Travel safely as you begin to return home. Hoping that you are carrying Israel with you in a new and inspiring way. Le'hitraot!

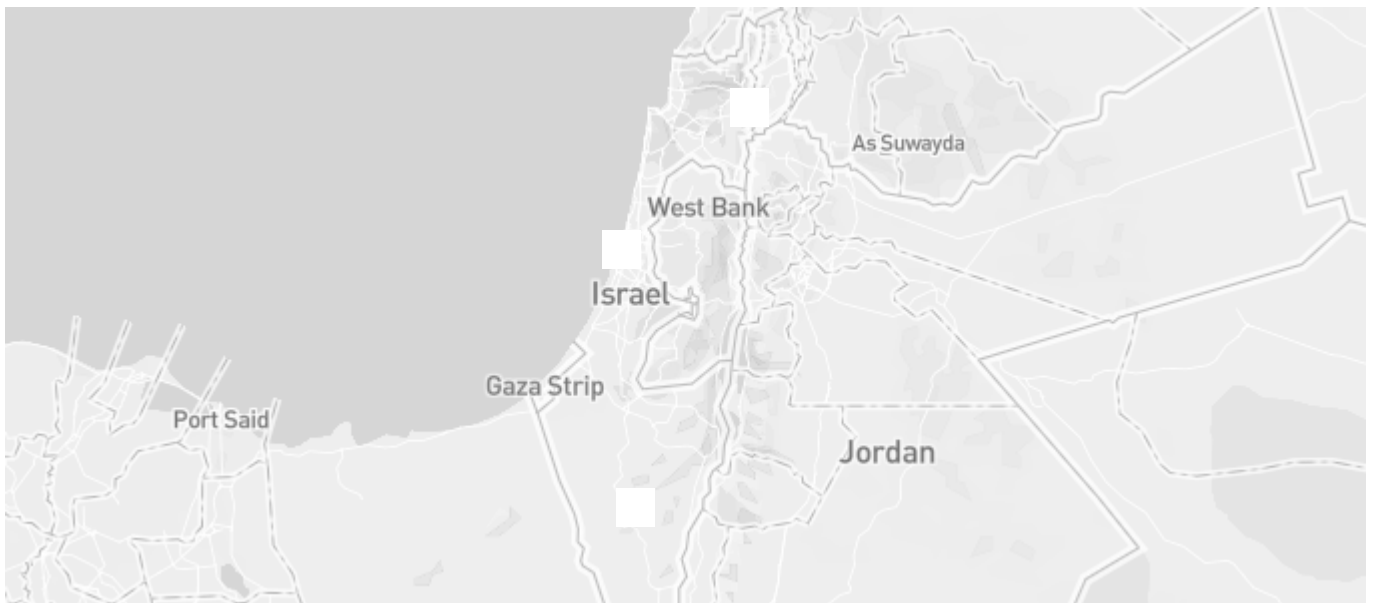
